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I. INTRODUCTION

Government Institute for Intellectual Disabilities (GRIID) is a premier institute fostering the needs of children with special educational needs. GRIID is catering to more than 450 children suffering from intellectual disability, autism, cerebral palsy and multiple disabilities. In addition to special education and vocational training, GRIID runs daily child guidance clinic for helping children with associated medical and behavioural problems through multidisciplinary team of medical specialists, physiotherapists, occupational therapists, speech therapists, yoga instructors, clinical psychologists and music therapy.^{85*}

GRIID is the State Nodal Agency Centre of the National Trust, Ministry of Social Justice, Govt. of India for implementing various schemes of National Trust including issuing of Guardianship certificates through Local Level Committee, Samarth-a permanent residential facility, and Nirmaya- a Health Insurance Scheme.

GRIID is running several Rehabilitation Council of India approved teachers training programs including 2 years Diploma in Special Education, 2 years B Ed in Special Education and 2 years M. Ed. in Special Education. The degree and master's level courses are affiliated to Panjab University, Chandigarh and recognized by Rehabilitation Council of India (RCI) a statutory body of Govt. of India.

II. OBJECTIVES OF THE COURSE-

- To function as teacher educator for RCI recognized teacher training courses
- To function as researchers in the field of Intellectual Disabilities, disability special and inclusive education.
- To function as educational program planners in general and inclusive schools.
- To function as school administrators and program heads

III. GENERAL FRAMEWORK OF THE COURSE

- Duration of the course for the degree of Master of Education Special Education (Intellectual Disability) (M.Ed.Spl. Edu. -ID) shall be two years.

IV. ELIGIBILITY

- A candidate who has successfully passed B.Ed. Special Education (Mental Retardation/Intellectual Disability) from a recognized University or any other Degree from a recognized University and considered equivalent to B.Ed. Special Education (MR/ID) by Rehabilitation Council of India (RCI).

OR

- A candidate who has successfully passed the B.Ed. (General) course and has completed Diploma in Education, Special Education (MR/ID), a PG Professional Diploma in Special Education (MR/ID) PGPDSE (MR) recognized by the Rehabilitation Council of India (RCI) till academic session 2014-15.
- Candidates with B.Ed. in particular specialization may be allowed for M.Ed. cross disability/ multicategory (as and when offered) but the reverse is not allowed. B.Ed. with multi-category should not be admitted for specialization in a single disability at the M.Ed. level, however; as a part of CBCS, these can be admitted to B.Ed. Special Education Area C courses and complete the specialization courses to qualify for a particular disability. On completion of Area C, these can be admitted to the M.Ed. Spl.Edu. in a specific disability.

OR

- A student with B.A./B.Sc./B.Com. B.Ed.Spl.Ed. (4 years Integrated)

OR

A student who have done BRS with specialization in B.Ed special education
(5% concession is admissible in eligibility marks to SC/ST/BC/PwD candidates)

V. ADMISSIONS

- The admission shall be based on merit on the basis of marks obtained in essential qualification or any other selection process as per guidelines of Panjab University and U.T. Administration.
- For those who have passed B.Ed. (General) and P.G. Professional Diploma in Mental Retardation., their marks of P.G. Diploma will be counted for calculation of merit, with 50%.
- All applicants for admission to M.Ed. Special Education (Intellectual Disability) course must be of good moral character.
- Admission will be done as per reservation policy of Chandigarh Administration by Panjab University. The reservation and relaxation for SC/ST/PWD and other categories shall be as per the rules of the central/Chandigarh Administration whichever is applicable.

VI. ATTENDENCE

The mandatory minimum attendance required is 80 % for all course work, 90% for all practicum.

VII. REGULATIONS FOR REAPPEARING IN THE EXAMINATION

VIII. MEDIUM OF INSTRUCTIONS

- English shall be the medium of instruction; however, the medium of the examination shall be English, Hindi and Punjabi.

IX. EXAMINATION AND EVALUATION

- Examinations shall be held according to the syllabus approved by the Senate from time to time.
- The examination shall be conducted at the end of each semester or as decided by the Panjab University.
- To be declared pass in a Semester Examination, a candidate must have obtained 40% marks in each theory paper, and 50% in each practicum both external and internal separately.
- Internal Evaluation/assessment – 20 Marks
- All practical would be evaluated externally and internally.

RESERVATION POLICY FOR CHANDIGARH COLLEGES: -

A candidate applying in the Reserved Categories shall carefully indicate his/her claim for category in the Admission Form. No change of category will be entertained/permitted in the application form or otherwise at a later stage.

A. UT Pool 60%: Out of the total sanctioned intake of the institutions **60% seats** will be filled up from amongst the students who passed their qualifying examination from colleges recognized by the Chandigarh Administration and situated in the Union Territory of Chandigarh as a regular student of the said Colleges/ Institutions, subject to the condition that such students must have studied for two years at Chandigarh. These seats will be termed as 'UT Pool'.

B. General Pool 40%: Out of the total sanctioned intake of the institutions **40% seats** will be filled from amongst the students who pass their qualifying examination from the institutions other than those located in the Union Territory of Chandigarh.

These seats will be termed as 'General Pool'. Students who have passed their qualifying examination through distance mode will be considered in General pool only.

- C. **EWS:** 10% over and above (additional) the total sanctioned intake of the institution will be filled from amongst the students who are from Economically Weaker Section (EWS) category from all over India.

Reservation:

☐ Scheduled Castes/ Scheduled Tribes

The following percentage of seats is prescribed for the students belonging to Scheduled Castes and Scheduled Tribes:

U.T. Pool:

Scheduled Caste – 15%

Scheduled Tribes – NIL

General Pool:

Scheduled Caste – 15%

Scheduled Tribes – 7.5%

If the requisite number of students of SC category in the UT Pool is not available, the seats will be made open to the students belonging to General category of the said pool. If the requisite number of students belonging to SC/ST categories is not available, the reservation will be interchangeable amongst the students of these communities. However, if the seats still remain unfilled, these will be made open amongst the students of the General category of the said-pool.

Ex-Serviceman, Dependents of Defence/ Para-Military Personnel etc:

5% of the seats in each pool would be filled in from the following categories of students in order of preference:

- (a) Sons/ daughters/spouses of the defence personnel who are awardees of gallantry decorations of Paramvir / Mahavir / Vir Chakra in person or posthumously OR Sons/ daughters/spouses of the defence personnel and Para-military personnel like CRPF, BSF etc. who are killed or are totally incapacitated in action while in service and were wholly dependent on them.
- (b) Sons/daughters/spouses of the defence and Para-military personnel like CRPF, BSF etc. who died while in service and were wholly dependent on them.
- (c) Sons/daughters/spouses of the defence and Para-military personnel like CRPF, BSF etc. incapacitated while in service and were wholly dependent on them.
- (d) Sons/daughters/spouses of ex-serviceman (defence and Para-military personnel like CRPF, BSF etc.) that are wholly dependent on them.
- (e) Sons/daughters/spouses of serving defence and Para-military personnel like CRPF, BSF etc. who are wholly dependent on them.

NOTE:

- i) The applicants seeking admission under categories (a) are required to submit the photocopy of citation for gallantry award, failing which they will not be considered for this category.
- ii) The applicants under category (b) and (c) are required to submit the certificate from the respective headquarters regarding death or total incapacitation while in service.
- iii) The applicants seeking admission to category (d) are required to submit discharge certificate from service and certificate of dependence from the **Director ZilaSainik Board**.

- iv) The applicants claiming admission under category (e) are required to submit the certificate of dependence from the unit in which parent/ spouse is serving.

❖ **Persons with Disability (PwD)**

5% seats in each pool would be filled from amongst the Persons with Disability candidates (1% each to be reserved for persons suffering from (i) Blindness or loss of vision (ii) Hearing impairment (iii) Locomotor disability or cerebral palsy). The students having temporary disability would not be considered against reserved seats. Eligible candidates will furnish a medical fitness certificate on the prescribed proforma from a Government Gazette Medical Officer along with the application indicating percentage of disability whether he/she is otherwise able to carry on the studies and perform the duties of a teacher, name of the disease-causing disability, whether disability is temporary or permanent, whether disability is progressive or non-progressive. Only such candidates whose disability is above **40% are eligible**. If such a certificate is not attached with the application, the candidate will not be considered for the seats reserved for this category.

The candidates selected provisionally for admission under this category will have to appear before the Medical Board constituted by the Principal Medical Officer, General Hospital, Sector 16, Chandigarh, for determining the percentage of disability / disability. The final selection will be made on the basis of the certificate issued by the Medical Doctor/Board. If the candidate does not present himself/ herself before the Medical Doctor/Board on the date intimated to him/her, his/her candidature against this category will be rejected and no subsequent opportunity will be given to him/her.

The members of persons with disability including blind and hearing impaired shall be allowed a relaxation of 5% marks for admission to the courses in which a certain percentage of minimum marks has been prescribed, provided they have obtained minimum pass marks prescribed by the regulations. (*Revised Guidelines for Reserved Category of Persons with Disabilities Candidates, No. 3500-3599/DUI/DS dated 01/07/2016*)

❖ **Children and Grandchildren of Freedom Fighters**

2% seats from each pool will be filled from the children and grandchildren of freedom fighters.

- (a) A freedom fighter is a person who has either been granted freedom fighter pension by the Chandigarh Administration or has been awarded **"Tamra Patra"** by Government of India for his political sufferings. No person other than the above-mentioned persons will be considered as freedom fighter for the purpose of reservation in admission. The requisite certificate will be issued by the **Deputy Commissioner, Chandigarh**, which will be considered irrespective of the form in which it is issued, provided it is self-explanatory.
- (b) Grand children mean son's sons/daughters or daughter's sons/ daughters.
- (c) The wards of freedom fighters who have been awarded **"Tamra Patras"** by the Government of India would also be eligible for reservation under this category. In the case of such freedom fighters, they should produce their **"Tamra Patras" certificate, freedom fighter certificate and dependence certificate from the Deputy Commissioner of the district in which they reside.**

NOTE: The applicants from this category will not be considered without the following documents:

- i) The photocopy of "Tamra Patra" certificate or freedom fighter certificate. ii) Dependence certificate from the concerned Deputy Commissioner.

Sportsmen/ Sportswomen

- (a) **2%** seats would be filled with sportsmen or sportswomen on the basis of their merits as per grading criteria forwarded by the Chandigarh Administration. This category shall not divide into UT Pool/General Pool. Benefits of reservation under this category shall be available only to the following categories of the students: -
- (i) Who passed their qualifying examination from colleges recognised by Chandigarh Administration and situated in the Union Territory of Chandigarh as a regular student of the said college, who have studied in Chandigarh colleges for at least two years before applying for gradation certificate subject to the condition that such students must represent Chandigarh state etc. in the national/ other recognised tournaments.
 - (ii) Where Chandigarh Administration has adopted the notification of other States/ U.T.s on reciprocal basis to give benefits of reservation in admission in Sports Category in Chandigarh, they will be graded as per existing policy of Chandigarh Administration.
 - (iii) Countersigning of Gradation certificates shall only be admissible on reciprocal basis provided that counter signed certificates will be graded as per policy of Chandigarh Administration.

The gradation for Sports person is as under, which should not be before 1st April, 2022.

NOTE: (c) Students seeking admission to this category shall be considered only:

- (i) If his/her age falls within the age group which is eligible for participation in the Inter-College/ Inter-University Tournaments.
- (ii) If his/her achievement in sports relates to his/her activity in any of the three years preceding admission. (For example, for admission in the year 2025, the achievements shall not be prior to the 1st April, 2022)

• Foreign students

2% seats are reserved for foreign students in B.Ed. course. The foreign students should submit along with their application the following documents without which they will not be considered for admission under this category:

- (i) Eligibility Certificate: If a student is seeking admission on the basis of foreign qualification.

- (ii) Long term student Visa
- (iii) Proof of foreign Nationality

NOTE:

- (i) Foreign students residing abroad should apply through their respective Embassies to the Secretary, Govt. of India, Ministry of External Affairs, New Delhi.
- (ii) Foreign Students desirous of seeking admission to B.Ed. course who are in India will compete amongst themselves for the seats created for them. Those living and applying from abroad shall be required to produce the test score of the Graduate Record Examination (GRE) from Princeton USA. Foreign Candidates shall also have to comply with all the requirements of Government of India, Chandigarh U.T. Administration as well as Panjab University as prescribed by them from time to time.

Admission of the foreign students to the college is governed by the guidelines issued by the Dean, Foreign Students, Panjab University, and Chandigarh.

- **Reservation for Economically Weaker Sections 10% over and above the sanctioned seats***

In compliance of letter vide the Home Department, Chandigarh Administration order no. 19/1/3-IH (3)-2019/4185 dated 01/05/2019, endorsed by Director Higher Education vide Endst. No. 239-DHE-UT-Ad.II-26(11) 2000-3 dated 24.05.2019

There is 10% reservation for the Economically Weaker Section for admission to City Colleges over and above the sanctioned seats. The persons belonging to Economically Weaker Sections (EWSs) from all over India would get benefit of 10% reservation in seats over and above the sanctioned intake for Admission in the Educational/ Technical/ Medical Institutions of Union Territory, Chandigarh.

Persons who are not covered under the existing scheme of reservations for the Scheduled Castes, the Scheduled Tribes and the Socially and Educationally Backward Classes and whose family has gross annual income below Rs. 8 lakhs are to be identified as EWSs for the benefit of reservation. Income shall also include income from all sources i.e. salary, agriculture, business, profession, etc. for the financial year prior to the year of application. Also, persons whose family owns or possesses any of the following assets shall be excluded from being identified as EWSs, irrespective of the family income:

- i. 5 acres of Agricultural Land and above; ii. Residential flat of 1000 sq. ft. and above; iii. Residential plot of 100 sq. yards and above in notified municipalities; iv. Residential plot of 200 sq. yards and above in areas other than the notified municipalities.

- i. The benefit of reservation under EWS can be availed upon production of an Income and Asset Certificate issued by a Competent Authority. The Income and Asset Certificate issued 'by any one of the following authorities in the prescribed format shall only be accepted as proof of candidate's claim as 'belonging to EWS:

- District Magistrate/Additional District Magistrate/ Collector/ Deputy Commissioner/Additional Deputy Commissioner/ 1st Class Stipendiary Magistrate/ Sub-Divisional Magistrate/ Taluka Magistrate/ Executive Magistrate/ Extra Assistant Commissioner
- Chief Presidency Magistrate/Additional Chief Presidency Magistrate/ Presidency Magistrate
- Revenue Officer not below the rank of Tehsildar and

- Sub-Divisional Officer of the area where the candidate and/or his family normally resides.

The reservation policy and seats as given above shall be strictly adhered to. In case seats in a reserved category remain vacant on account of non-availability of qualified candidates such seats may be filled up from the General category. The candidate who had applied for a reserved category will be considered for that particular category only.

This reservation is in accordance to the Home Policy of Chandigarh Administration, Chandigarh.

Students are also supposed to submit one copy of their Adhaar Card, 3 Passport Size Photographs for ID cards along with declaration of Anti-Ragging.

XVI. HOW TO OBTAIN THE APPLICATION CUM PROSPECTUS AND COUNSELLING DATE

The prescribed application form and prospectus may be obtained from the Official website of the Govt. Rehabilitation Institute for Intellectual Disabilities, Sector-31-C, and Chandigarh 160047 which is www.griid.edu.in

The application form duly filled in should be submitted in the **office of Govt. Rehabilitation Institute for Intellectual Disabilities, Sector-31-C, Chandigarh-160047**, by hand or by Regd. post by last date published in the newspaper before 4 P.M. **Applications received after the last date will not be considered.** The date and place of Counselling will be notified separately in the official website of GRIID.

XVII. HOUSE EXAMINATION & TEACHING PRACTICE

In order to become eligible to appear in the University Examination under semester system, the students are required to appear and obtain a minimum of 50% marks in each theory subjects and 50% in practical in-house examinations in each semester.

Absence from these examinations on any ground will be treated as failure and the principal will have the authority to withhold or withdraw the name of the absentee / failure from the University examination. No request would be entertained for grant of leave from the house test.

No House Test / Internal Theory Exam will be reconducted in any circumstances.

Students using unfair means in the house examinations are liable to be expelled from the college.

XVIII. LEAVE RULES

1. Students should apply for leave on the plain paper
2. Prior sanction of leave must be taken
3. In case of sickness or an emergency, the leave application must be submitted within a week.
4. Application for sick leave for more than five days will have to be supported by a Medical Certificate from a Government Dispensary / Hospital. If more than 5 days get a certificate from PU medical officer.
5. **No leave will be sanctioned during the house tests and practical.**

XIX. GENERAL INSTRUCTIONS AND CODE OF CONDUCT FOR THE STUDENTS

1. 80% attendance is compulsory. There will be no relaxation in this regard. This applies for theory teaching (80%) and the practicum (90%).
2. The trainees are expected to follow the time table strictly. In the event of being late, he/she will treat as absent for the whole day.
3. The trainees are required to follow proper dress code as prescribed by the institution
4. Assignment of duties in the school function is the part of their training they are expected to complete such assignment efficiently.

5. The students are required to participate in all scheduled activities of the college 6. The students are required to take all examinations and undertake all practical work.
7. Mobiles are not permitted in classrooms, library, reading room, labs, and corridors. In case of any emergency, they may use college telephone.
8. Smoking, drinking alcohol and playing cards and any substance abuse on the college campus is strictly prohibited.
9. **Students must make it a point to read the Notice Board daily. Ignorance of orders/notices duly displayed on the Notice Board shall not be accepted as an excuse for non- compliance.**

 - a)The book borrowed from ordinary section is not returned by due date. The book which is recalled by the library is not returned within the stipulated period, and the book issued for overnight use is not returned in time.
Please Note: -
 - b)Reserve copy, issued for overnight use, shall have to be returned within one and a half hour of the opening of the library, next day.
 - c)If due date of overnight book is on holiday/Sunday, return it on next working day before 10:00 am otherwise fine would be charged including holiday/Sunday Rs. 1/- per day.

CIRCULATION RULES

1. Borrowing facilities are given only to the member of the library. Books may be borrowed only against the library Card/Ticket issued to an individual. Borrowing will be done only through the counter. The Card/Ticket is nontransferable.
2. Books are issued and returned from 9:20 a.m. to 1:00 p.m. and 1:30 to 4:40 p.m. ☐ 9:20 AM to 1:40 PM on Saturday
3. The library member is responsible for any book issued against that Card/Ticket, as per the library record.
4. Newspapers, periodicals & reference books will not be issued from the library.
5. The user should check the books thoroughly for missing pages, chapters etc. While getting them issued. No complaint will be entertained later on.
6. No books in damaged condition will be accepted from the users on return. Damaged books will have to be replaced by the borrower.
7. In case of loss of books by borrower, the borrower is required either to replace the books by a recent edition, if available or pay its cost.
8. If a member loses a book issued against his/her Card/Ticket, the penalty will be as follows:
 1. Current cost of the book along with amount delayed fine.

2. If the relevant book is not easily available in the market then the user would pay the current cost of the book.
9. If a member loses his / her Card/Ticket /ID card, and he/she makes a written report. Member will be responsible for misuse lost card and a duplicate card will be issued after written application and pay the fine of Rs 100/-
10. The Librarian can recall books and publications any time if need arises.

GENERAL RULES

- All library users must sign in/out register available with the attendant at the gate.
- User should maintain peace in the library and should not disturb other readers in the library.
- Smoking/eating/use of mobile phone/drinking/sleeping is strictly prohibited in the library premises.
- While entering the library user should leave his/her personal belongings such as bags, personal books etc. at the counter reserved for this purpose. Loose papers and notebooks may however be taken into the library. Users leaving the library should permit the library staff to examine their personal belongings. If asked.

- The Members / Readers are not allowed to bring personal books or other reading material to the library except in the area meant for such a purpose.
- The Library Staff cannot be held responsible for loss or damage to any personal belongings of the members / readers.
- Computer terminals provided in the library for searching the Online Public Access catalogues, CDRom databases, or retrieving any other online information made available through Library systems. Use of these terminals for any unauthorized purpose or external networks, changing or damaging the hardware/software settings, data or any other illegal activity will be liable for punitive action.

USER ASSISTANCE

All members of the library team are available for any assistance one may need in using the library resources, facilities & services they are also welcome to offer suggestion for improving library & its environment.
