incorporates elements that stimulate the senses of sight, sound, touch, taste, smell, and proprioception.






MIME COMPETITION (VIRTUAL MODE)

DENTAL CHECKUP CAMP FOR THE SPECIAL CHILDREN ON THE OCCASION OF WORLD DOWN SYNDROME DAY (21ST MARCH 2025)

On the occasion of World Down Syndrome Day i.e. 21st March GRIID organized a special dental checkup camp under the supervision of Dr. Gurvanit Kaur Lehl, Professor & Head of the Dental Department at GMCH, along with a dedicated team from PGIMER, Chandigarh. Dental checkup drive focused on providing screening and dental care for children with Down Syndrome. A total of 51 children were examined during the camp. Students who require further treatment were also referred to GMCH-32 and PGIMER, Chandigarh, for specialized health care facilities.

Parents who attended the camp appreciated the efforts and found it to be beneficial. Parents also requested similar health care initiatives in the future to ensure continued medical support for children with special needs. The collaborative effort between GRIID, GMCH, and PGIMER highlighted the importance of oral health care for children with Down Syndrome and reinforced the commitment to their overall well-being.

GRIID CLINIC ACTIVITIES

DISABILITY DIAGNOSTIC CAMPS

Several camps were organized in collaboration with the Department of Psychiatry, GMCH & GRIID Clinic under Samagra Shiksha at various Government schools in Chandigarh for the assessment of Specific Learning Disability (SLD) and intellectual disability (ID) from January to March 2025.

On 3rd February, a medical assessment camp was held at Govt. Model Senior Secondary School (GMSSS) Sector-47 D, Chandigarh, where 27 Children with special needs were assessed, 8 IQ certificates were issued and 19 were referred to GMCH-32 for SLD assessment. In GMSSS, MHC medical camp was held on 10th February where a total of 30 CWSN were assessed, out of which 18 were referred to GMCH for SLD assessment. Next Camp was held on 17th February at GMSSS, Mauli Jagran, Chandigarh, where 3 IQ certificates were distributed out of 30 patients.



17th February 2025 at GMSSS, Mauli Jagran, Chandigarh Another camp was conducted on 3rd March at GMSSS, Sector-29 C, Chandigarh. A total of 26 Patients were assessed. 1 IQ certificate was issued,12 were referred

to GMCH-32, Chandigarh, for SLD assessment,1 was diagnosed as ADHD, 3 children were normal, 7 cases were borderline IQ.



DOWN SYNDROME DAY (21st March, 2025)

On 21st March, Down's Syndrome Day was observed, where children from school as well as from attending clinic follow-up were called for a dental checkup, in which their dental problems were dealt by dental staff from PGIMER and GMCH, Chandigarh. A total 49 children were checked for their dental problems.

As part of the Community-Based Rehabilitation (CBR) initiative, Dr. Yashvinder Kapil, CBR In-Charge, along with Ms. Seema, Clinical Psychologist, from CBR team, conducted an IQ assessment at the doorstep of a child with disability.



During the visit, the team not only completed the assessment but also provided valuable guidance to the parents regarding various support services and benefits available through GRIID and other government and

non-government agencies. This CBR effort aimed to provide holistic support and promote the overall development and well-being of the child.

As part of the mandatory curriculum for the two-year Diploma in Special Education (Intellectual and Developmental Disabilities), trainees are required to engage in practical work within Community-Based Rehabilitation (CBR) settings. Under the supervision of Dr. Yashvinder Kapil, In-charge of the CBR program, all D.Ed. trainees participated in various communities across Chandigarh for over a month as part of their practical work. During this period, trainees gained practical experience in assessing and managing children with high support needs. They also set individualised goals and provided training in self-help skills to twenty-two such children residing in local colonies and villages of Chandigarh.



TRANSFORMED DISABILITIES INTO ABILITIES

The primary objective of the event was to educate the general public about the causes, symptoms, prevention, and treatment of TB, as well as to dispel common myths and reduce the stigma associated with the disease. Students from D.Ed. 2nd year and a group of girls from B.Ed. 2nd year actively participated in the event, contributing with great enthusiasm and dedication. As part of the campaign, the students prepared and displayed informative posters

that highlighted key facts about tuberculosis, including how it spreads, the symptoms to look out for, and available treatment options.
